FOUR WORKSHOPS IN PARALLEL

• Group 1 - Host : S&D FEMM

My body, my choice (focus on mobilization for access to contraception and safe and legal abortion)

Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights -SRHR cover among other sex and relationship education, access to contraception and to safe and legal abortions, treatment of sexually transmitted diseases and the tackling of sexual violence. Currently four EU member states criminalise abortion, while pre- and post-natal health services are hit due to the crisis. A Barometer of Women's Access to Modern Contraceptive Choice in 16 EU member states also highlights that women's access to modern contraceptives varies significantly. Significantly, very few national policies have improved, and alarmingly in most countries, the situation has stagnated, or even worsened, over the past few years. The discussion will focus on how to support sexual and reproductive health and rights in the context of a conservative backlash,

with a focus on creative skills and exchange of communication strategies from national experiences.

• Group 2 - Host : PES Women

Gender Equality and Cyber empowerment

How to guarantee the freedom of speech of women and LGBTI in the digital age and the context of a severe religious, socially conservative or extreme backlash on the slow progress made by the fight for gender equality, which translates into violence, harassment, cyber stalking and cyber bullying. The political debate online is too often over-dominated by men expressing strong opinions while women prefer to stay aside and remain almost invisible. Some communities are organising in order to systematically exclude women, such as the online gaming community where some are trying to recreate a man's club. This, however, is also the sign that women are making their way into all corners of the internet, meeting some resistance, but also breaking grounds.

• Group 3: Host YES and FEPS

Women in Science - A Millennial perspective

Close your eyes and picture a renowned scientist. Odds are high that you probably weren't thinking of a woman. Such gender stereotypes are still a reality. Although seven out of ten girls show an interest in science, only two out of ten will pursue it as a career. In an age where economic growth, social and environmental sustainability go hand in hand with science literacy, all citizens should be able to face science-related challenges – and this goes not only for future scientists or engineers. Education is key for social change and for the achievement of fundamental human rights and empowering Millennial in future-oriented fields.

Join an exciting workshop with FEPS and YES to debate the feminisation of certain subjects in academic curricula, gender stereotypes and tell us how Progressives can be the ones to empower Millennial young women to pursue career opportunities in science and technology education.

• Group 4: Host Rainbow Rose

The European lesbian* movement: what movement is needed to give ensure visibility to Lesbians in the public sphere?

After the successful European Lesbian* Conference (ELC) in Vienna on 6-8 October 2017, Rainbow Rose (LGBTI Network of the Party of European Socialists), the workshop will discuss: how important is it to have a dedicated structured Lesbian* movement in Europe? How to best fight for LBT rights within the LGBTI community? Is there a need for a specific movement within LGBTI community? How the ELC can fit with the feminist movement? The interactive workshop will start with a quick historical game on the lesbian and trans movement, followed by an exchange of views with key member of the ELC conference and other LGBTI actors in Europe to talk about lesbian movement in Europe among others.
