14:30 EWL #HerNetHerRights workshop: Breaking the silence on gender-based online violence

The internet is an incredible tool and has empowered women to speak up, react and organize themselves to face patriarchy and oppression. However, the internet is not a neutral place – sexist, racist, homophobic and other violent types of behaviour and content are disproportionately affecting women.

The rise of online violence against women and girls (VAWG) has denied women autonomy over their own bodies and voices in cyberspaces, causing not only severe social implications on their online and offline lives but also has lifelong consequences in terms of mental and physical health and wellbeing. While people of all genders report being targets of violence, compared to men, women suffer the most violent forms of aggression and are the most affected by their consequences. Women are targeted because of their sex/gender and encounter diverse forms of violence by different types of perpetrators. Impunity prevails mostly due to the root causes of gender inequalities, such as unequal power relations between women and men, the structure of the tech industry and the nature of online spaces. With this workshop, PES Women wants to continue the cooperation with the European Women's Lobby (EWL) to inform and raise awareness about the phenomenon and provide the participants with tools, mechanisms and laws to combat such violence and formulate a set of concrete policy proposals. 16:30 YES and FEPS workshop: Empowering women and girls for climate justice

Women and girls face higher risks and greater burdens from the impacts of climate change. As climate change effects are becoming more acute, empowering women and girls is key. Young female activists have been at the forefront in the climate marches and actions but the truth is that environmental decision-making bodies and leadership positions continue to be heavily male dominated at all levels. This constitutes a major barrier preventing women from fully contributing to climate-related planning, policy-making and implementation. Therefore, the Foundation for European Progressive Studies (FEPS) and the Young European Socialists (YES) join forces in this interactive workshop to focus on the major impact of climate change for women and girls and the necessary climate justice to be set up to empower women and girls in the relationship with the achievement of the 2030 agenda and the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action adopted exactly 25 years ago.

"We believe in a Feminist Europe. We want a holistic, transformational socioeconomic vision, based on well-being, equality, social justice, and a powerful voice against women's poverty. We envisage a culture in which women enjoy equal rights and participation in reimagined power and decision-making structures, in which all forms of violence against women has been eliminated, and women have been liberated from all forms of oppression. We envision a society in which women's contribution to all aspects of life is recognised, rewarded and celebrated - in leadership, in care and in production; all women have freedom of choice, self-confidence, and freedom from exploitation; and no woman has been left behind."

Asha Allen and Manon Deshayes from the Policy and Campaigns Hub will present EWL's Herstory and ongoing advocacy priorities, specifically presenting our strategy around the EU institutions and the upcoming Gender Equality Strategy.
